What does this mean for you as a GPC?


- GPCs have external evidence of their skills and competencies in the field.
- The GPC Exam is not just a test; it is a recognized assessment of our accredited GPC program.
- The accreditation by NCCA proves the worth of the credential. It makes the GPC worth even more.
- An accredited program protects the public and, specifically, employers who seek to hire skilled and ethical grant professionals.
- Accreditation of a credential by a nationally recognized body such as NCCA acknowledges the rigorous, high-quality certification program that GPCI has developed and maintained.

CMP Manual & Application

- Revised manual and application in June 2019

GPC Status, CMP Points & Fees

- GPA member (chapter affiliation not required)
 - Minimum 105 points required
 - CMP Fee: \$180
- Non-GPA member
 - Minimum 105 points required
 - CMP Fee: \$305
- GPA Retired Status
 - Minimum 50 points required
 - CMP Fee: \$100



GPC Retired Status

Qualifications

- Already renewed GPC once through CMP process
- No longer working as a paid grant professional (deriving less than 25% of income from grant services)

Requirements

- \$100 nonrefundable fee
- 50 points minimum required in CMP application (compared to 105 for GPC)
- Cannot list activities in Category 2 (Grant Professional Employment) of application
- Must use "GPC Retired" in place of "GPC" after name (i.e.: Jane Doe, GPC Retired)

CMP Application Grace Period

- Three-month grace period to submit CMP application beyond original expiration date
- Activities within application must be completed prior to original expiration date
- \$100 late fee applies in addition to applicable CMP renewal fees
- Name removed from list of credentialed professionals on GPCI's website until CMP application is approved
- Lapses beyond the grace period deadline forfeits ability to use CMP must retake exam to become recertified

Cohort	Conferred Date	CMP Application Date	Grace Period Expiration
1	January, February, March	March 1	June 1
2	April, May, June	June 1	September 1
3	July, August, September	September 1	December 1
4	October, November, December	December 1	March 1



Continuing Education Categories

- Category 1: Education (60 points max)
- Category 2: Grant Professional Employment (36 points max)
- Category 3: Contributions to the Field (60 points max)
- Category 4: Professional Service (60 points max)
- Category 5: Independent Project (60 points max)





Category 1: Education

- One point per one hour of education workshops, seminars, and conferences
 - Minimum of 20% of total points outside of candidate's institution
 - Maximum of 50% of total points for activities that are not directly grant related, but will enhance the performance of grant professional
- 30 points for one academic degree acquired during CMP period
- **Mentorships** points available for mentee and mentor (see specifics depending on the activities on page 10)

Category 1: Education

GPA's Annual Conferences

- Earn one point for every hour of workshop attendance
- Includes keynote and luncheon speakers/panels
- Social or networking events, such as a welcome reception and award ceremonies, are NOT eligible for points
- Used to be eligible for 20 points for attending 2.5-day conference
- As of 2018 Annual Conference was worth 13.25 points max (will change depending on conference schedule)

Category 1: Education

Common Errors

- Claim too many points for GPA Annual Conference
- Courses listed that are not grant-related and not clearly defined as to how they enhance a grant professional's work
- Presentations listed that they taught vs. attended in this section
- List WAY more points than the maximum allowed in this section

Category 2: Grant Professional Employment

- One point per one full month of full-time work
- Partial job duties (% of job is grant related) or part-time work can be prorated
- Paid coursework or presentations
 - One point per credit hour taught
 - 0.25 points per 2 hours of a paid presentation

Category 2: Grant Professional Employment

Common Errors

- GPC Retired candidates claiming points in this section
- List too many total points for this section (due to full time job and consultant work on the side)

Category 3: Contributions to the Field

- Communications Projects (i.e. books, sustained editor, journal and newsletter articles, podcasts)
- Participation on grant review panels 10 points per panel, one per year
- **Grant-related management projects** that have <u>outcomes that directly</u> <u>impact the development function of the organization</u> 15 points per project

Specific grants you were awarded and/or managed are <u>NOT</u> eligible for CMP points.

Category 3: Contributions to the Field

- Conference/Workshop Presentation 1 point per hour
- Coordinating/Facilitating GPC Exam Study Groups- 1 point per hour
- Obtaining a recognized psychometrically proven professional credential from a related field (i.e. CFRE) 10 points total

Category 3: Contributions to the Field

Common Errors

- List all the grants that they managed in the three years, not grant management projects that relate to the development function of their organization
- Claim workshops they've taught that may pertain to the field they work in, but is not directly grant-related (trends of child poverty in rural areas, etc.)
- List too many total points for this section

- Professional Associations National Membership (GPA or other grant-related)
 - **Member** 2 points maximum per year
 - Committee member 4 points maximum per year
 - Committee officer or chair 8 points maximum per year
 - **Board member** 12 points maximum per year

Membership points within this section are not cumulative, but you can claim points for both National and Local Chapter membership(s).

- **Professional Associations Local/Chapter Membership** (GPA Chapter or other grant-related local chapter)
 - Chapter member 2 points maximum per year
 - Chapter Officer/Committee Chair 4 points maximum per year
 - Regional Representative 4 points maximum per year

Membership points within this section are not cumulative, but you can claim points for both National and Local Chapter membership(s).

- Grant-related Conference Activities (both national and local)
 - Conference Chair 20 points
 - Conference Planning Committee Member 10 points
 - Conference Volunteer 0.5 points per volunteer hour (max 10 points per event)

- Community Service 1 point per 4 hours, up to 10 points max per year
- Pro Bono Work— 1 point per 4 hours, up to 10 points max per year
- Special Task Force, Ad Hoc Committee, Professional Service Projects 10 points (or the approved amount given by project coordinator)
- Internships (non-paid) 15 points per quarter, 60 points max

Common Errors

- Apply cumulative points within one category of professional association (i.e.: claiming points for being a chapter board member and chapter member during the same timeframe)
- Claim incorrect number of points for national and chapter memberships
- List too many total points in this section

Category 5: Independent Project

- Must be pre-approved by the GPCI Board (allow up to 60 days for approval)
- Project must be completed prior to application deadline
- Examples:
 - Literature Review
 - Accepted Provider Program Review
 - Dissertation with research focusing on the grant profession



CMP Audit

- Supporting documentation **NOT** required with submission (honor system)
- 10% of applicants will be audited
- Audit conducted in October of 4th cohort of previous year and 1st to 3rd cohorts of the current year (i.e.: 4th of 2018 and 1st, 2nd and 3rd cohorts of 2019)
- Announcement letters go out on October 1
- Auditees have 30 days to supply their supporting documentation for the activities listed in their CMP application (by November 1)
- Audit team has 30 days to review and respond with result (by December 1)

Supporting Documentation

- For educational events: Paid registration receipts, course/workshop outline or agenda, or course/workshop handouts
- For grant professional employment: Simple letter from employer stating when CMP candidate was employed in grant-related activities or pay stubs with all personal information redacted
- For contributions to the field: Actual articles written, copy of book cover with author's name indicated, course outlines, etc.
- For professional projects: Board minutes showing attendance, certificate showing volunteerism, letters from those who received pro bono services, etc.
- For independent projects: Will be jointly agreed upon prior to undertaking the independent project (usually an approval email)
